Mark 9:2-13, Pew Bible p. 844

² And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, ³ and his clothes became radiant, intensely white, as no one on earth could bleach them. ⁴ And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, and they were talking with Jesus. ⁵ And Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah." ⁶ For he did not know what to say, for they were terrified. ⁷ And a cloud overshadowed

them, and a voice came out of the cloud, "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." ⁸ And suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone with them but Jesus only.

⁹ And as they were coming down the mountain, he charged them to tell no one what they had seen, until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. ¹⁰ So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what this rising from the dead might mean. ¹¹ And they asked him, "Why do the scribes say that first Elijah must come?" ¹² And he said to them, "Elijah does come first to restore all things. And how is it written of the Son of Man that he should suffer many things and be treated with contempt? ¹³ But I tell you that Elijah has come, and they did to him whatever they pleased, as it is written of him."'''

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Sermon Questions for June 19, 2022
The Gospel of Mark “Press On”
Mark 9:2-13

1. Can you share with your community group a story of experiencing “glory” in your own life? For example, a personal accomplishment, a child or other family member’s victory, or maybe an actual “sense” of the glory of God? What does your heart really yearn for?
2. What is the context of this story of the transfiguration of Christ?
3. How does the fact that Jesus “must suffer” relate to the transfiguration of Jesus? What did we learn about the sufferings of Christ from Mark 8:31-38 and the call taking up the cross and following Jesus?
4. The word for transfiguration is also used in Romans 12:2. How are we to be transformed and what does that look like?
5. Why did Jesus take with him Peter, James, and John? What can we learn from that? Why do you think Peter wanted to stay?
6. What does the transfiguration teach us about Jesus? What was briefly displayed about him?
7. How is the Trinity displayed in this? Why is Moses and Elijah present?
8. Is any hope promised to us in this story?
9. Jesus brought them down to press onward. We know they indeed did. How does Jesus want you to press on?
